Play Me, I'm Yours by Luke Jerram

Touring internationally since 2008, Play Me I'm Yours is an artwork by British artist Luke Jerram that places pianos in parks, squares, on streets and in other fun public spaces for anyone to discover and play. Each piano acts as a sculptural, musical, blank canvas that becomes a reflection of the community around it.



The pianos have brought many hidden musicians from out of the woodwork. It has become apparent that there are hundreds of pianists out there who don't have access to a piano to play. Play Me I'm Yours provides musicians with access to musical instruments and an opportunity to share their creativity by performing in public.

The website **www.cincinnatipianos.com** is there for the public to post their photos, videos and comments about the pianos and to describe their use. The site documents each piano's journey, while connecting the street pianos and their communities across the Greater Cincinnati area.

Luke Jerram's multidisciplinary practice involves the creation of sculptures, installations, live arts projects and gifts. Since his professional career as an artist began in 1997, Luke has created a number of extraordinary art projects which excite and inspire people around him. Learn more at www. lukejerram.com.

In addition to those pianos decorated by the artist Luke Jerram, six of the pianos have been painted by student artists from Artworks. Another ten pianos have been decorated through the summer art programs at participating Community Arts Centers. When the project is complete, the pianos will be donated to children in need of a piano, as well as the Community Arts Centers.

About ArtWorks: Founded in 1996, ArtWorks is a non-profit arts organization that connects artists of all ages with opportunities in the arts through inspiring apprenticeships, community partnerships, and public art.
